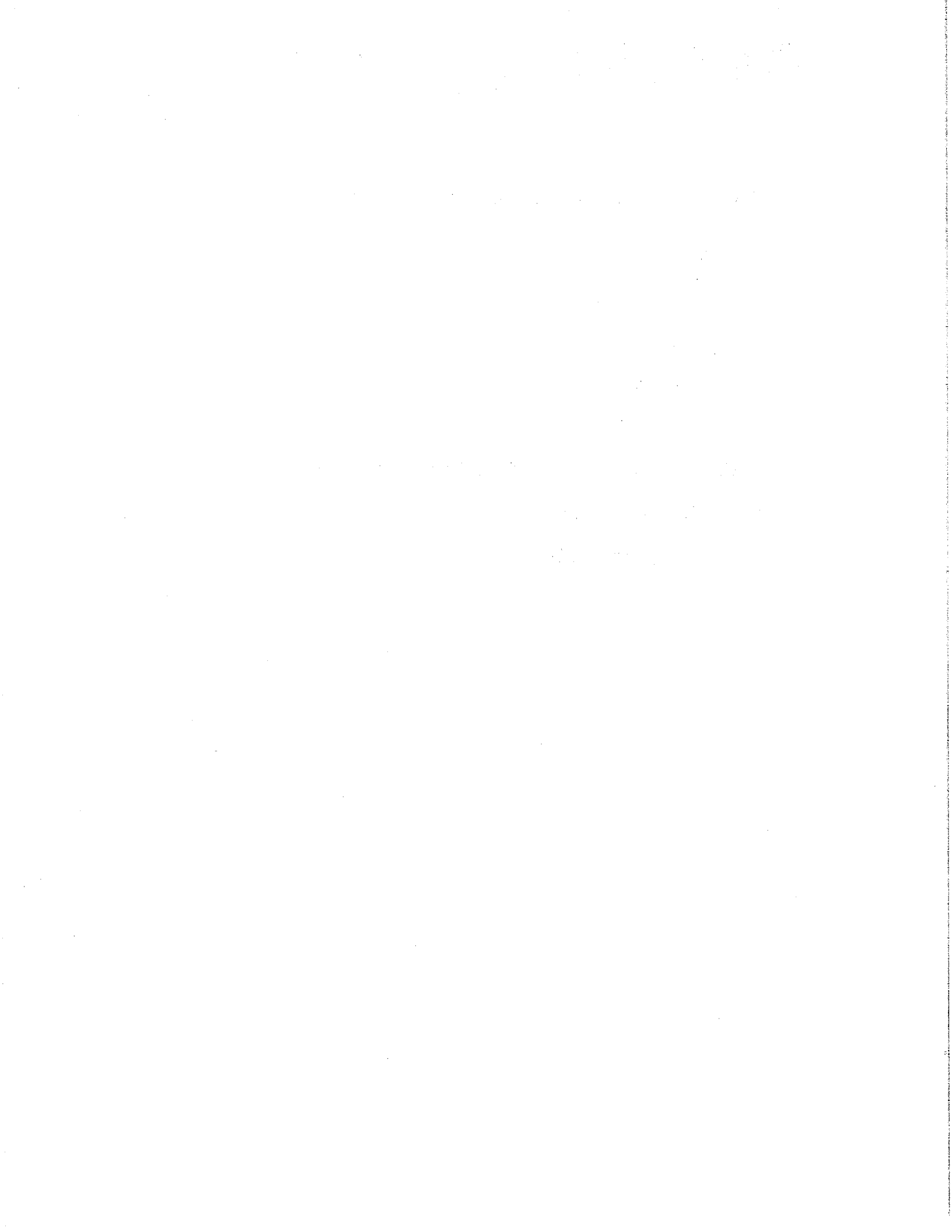

Hands-on crafts, including Vision Bingo and bracelet making, further supported creativity, confidence, and self-expression in a fun and engaging way.

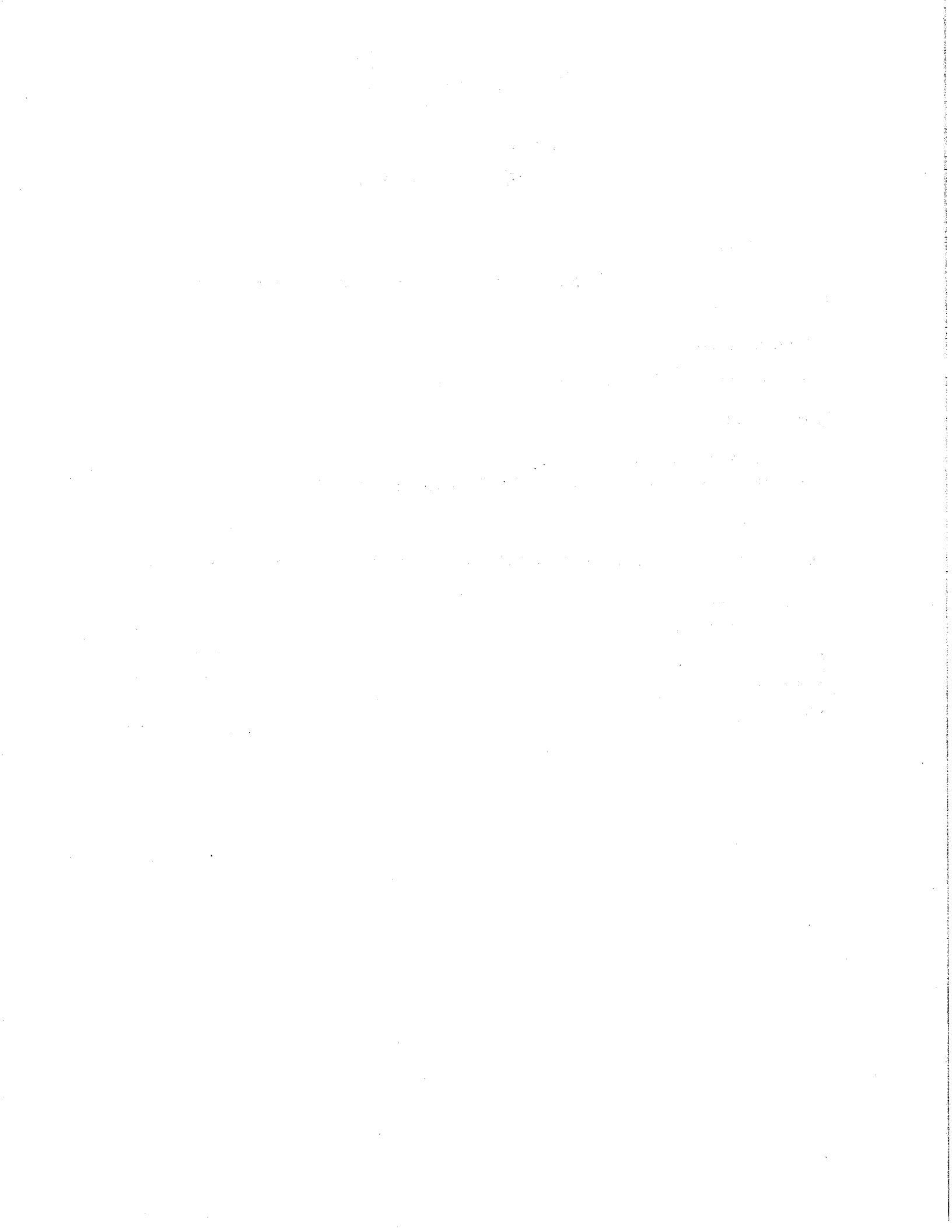
