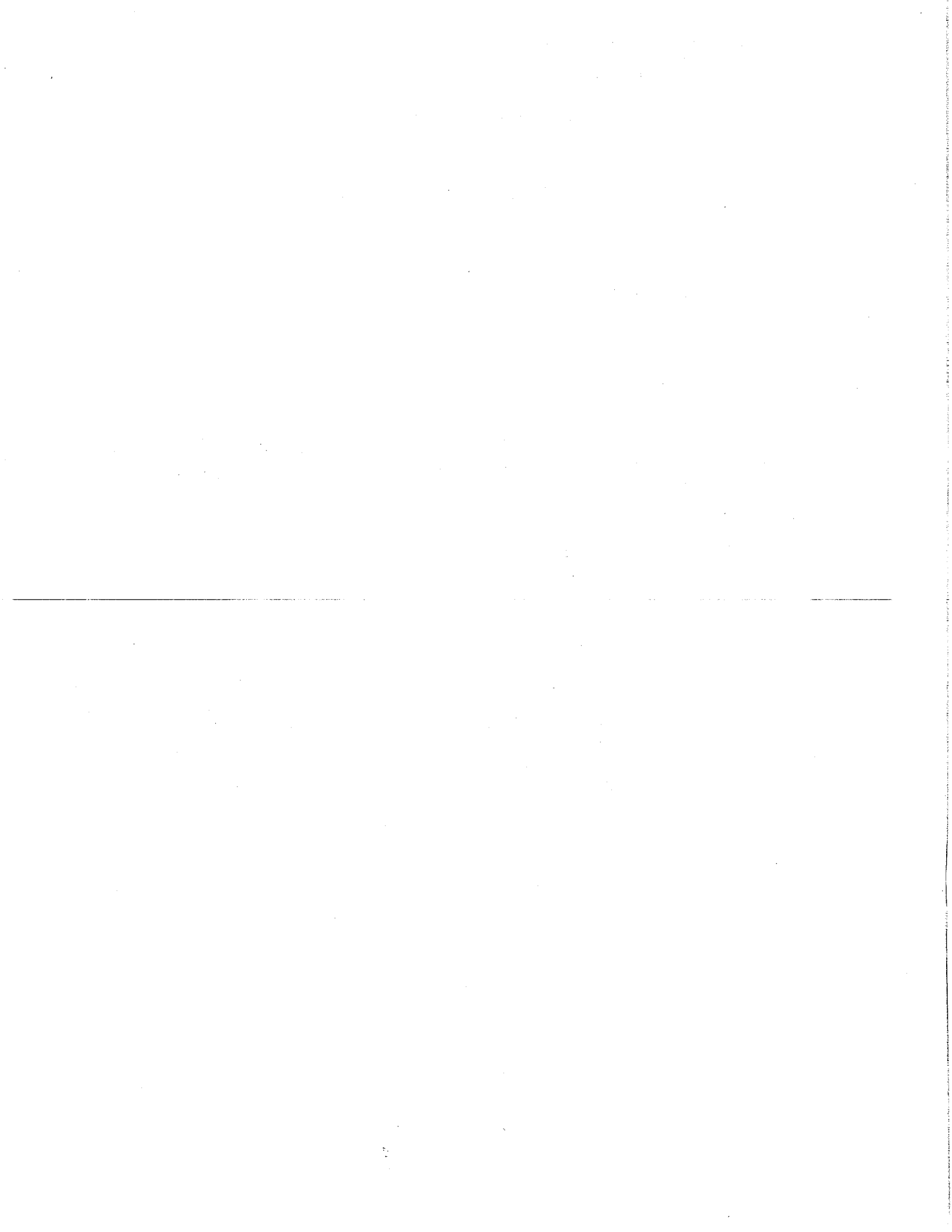

Center Highlights:

The month of February was busy at CSFRC. Care and Share, a \$501 energy benefit program started on the 9th with families calling daily. If they are too far away, they are referred to the closest PEACE, Inc. family resource center. The after school youth group "Bright Futures" went on a field trip to Greek Peak during winter break and had fun at the water park. PEACE, Inc. staff provided refreshments and a senior information session at the Meadows. Topics covered included the MSP program, HEAP, SNAP and Care and Share. Also discussed was the intake process at our center. A homeless family was finally permanently housed at the Meadows. Several rides, transportation services and food deliveries were made this month as usual.

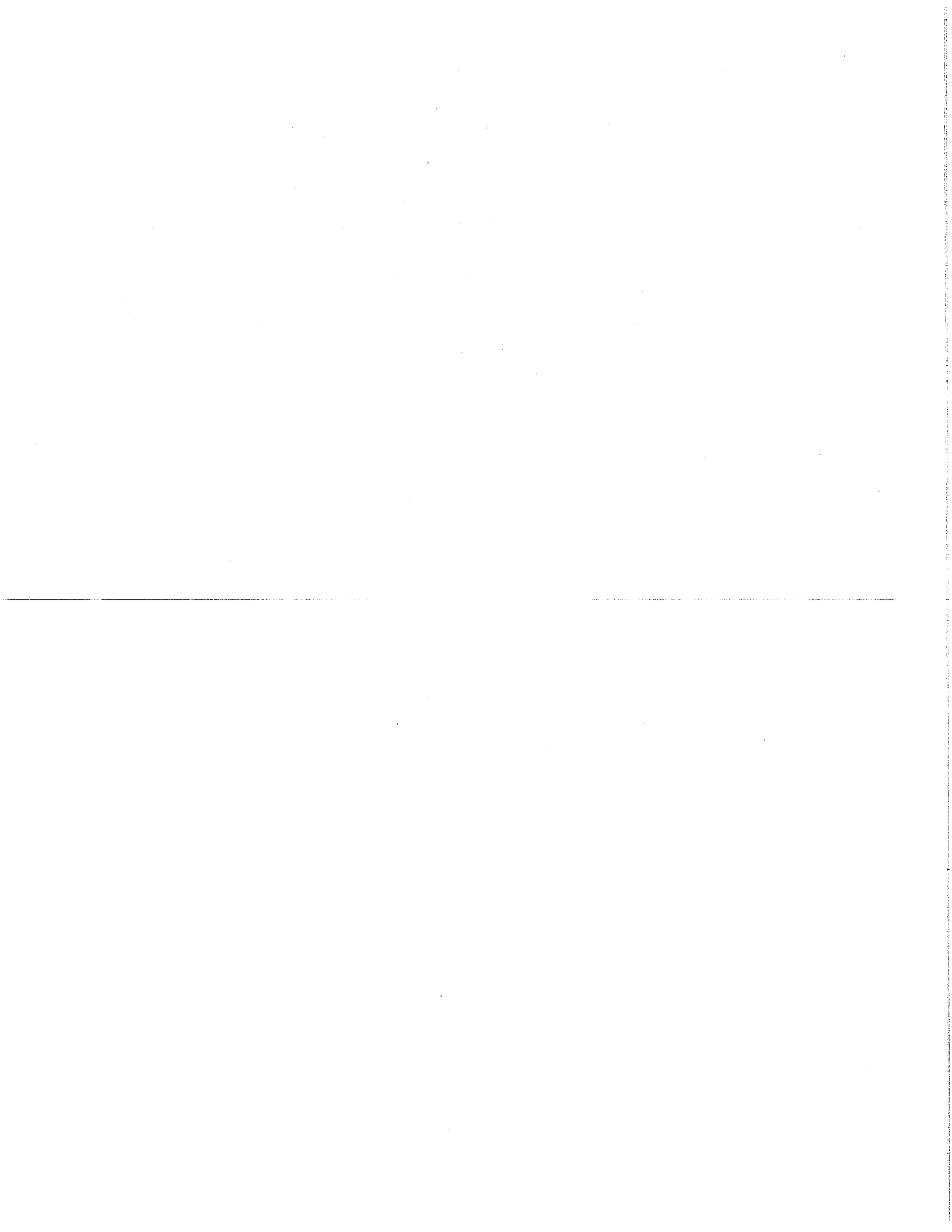

Center Highlights:

This month the Girls Circle group participants' session focused on helping girls understand their worth, set healthy boundaries, and make wise choices. Participants create a personalized "HeartWise Treasure Chest" filled with affirmations, boundary cards, and personal treasures that represent their goals and values. The key lesson emphasizes that only trusted, safe people should have access to their hearts.

The partnership with the Lead Lyft Rides Program has continue. Our clients especially seniors have expressed satisfaction with having reliable transportation available, as it has made a meaningful difference in their ability to attend appointments and access needed services.

On February 11th, our *Fatherhood with PEACE* Program will proudly celebrate and graduate the fathers of Cohort 11. We honor their commitment, growth, and dedication to strengthening themselves, their families, and their communities. The journey continues as Cohort 12 begins on March 4 and runs through June 17, 2026. We look forward to welcoming the next group of fathers-ready-to-grow, lead, and build lasting legacies.

Alex from the Food Bank of Central New York presented to GASC about eating healthier on a budget by adding more beans and vegetables to meals. They demonstrated a simple Cowboy Salad (Bean Salsa) and explained how to cook with dried, canned, fresh green, and frozen beans. The session highlighted beans as an affordable, nutritious, and versatile food option.

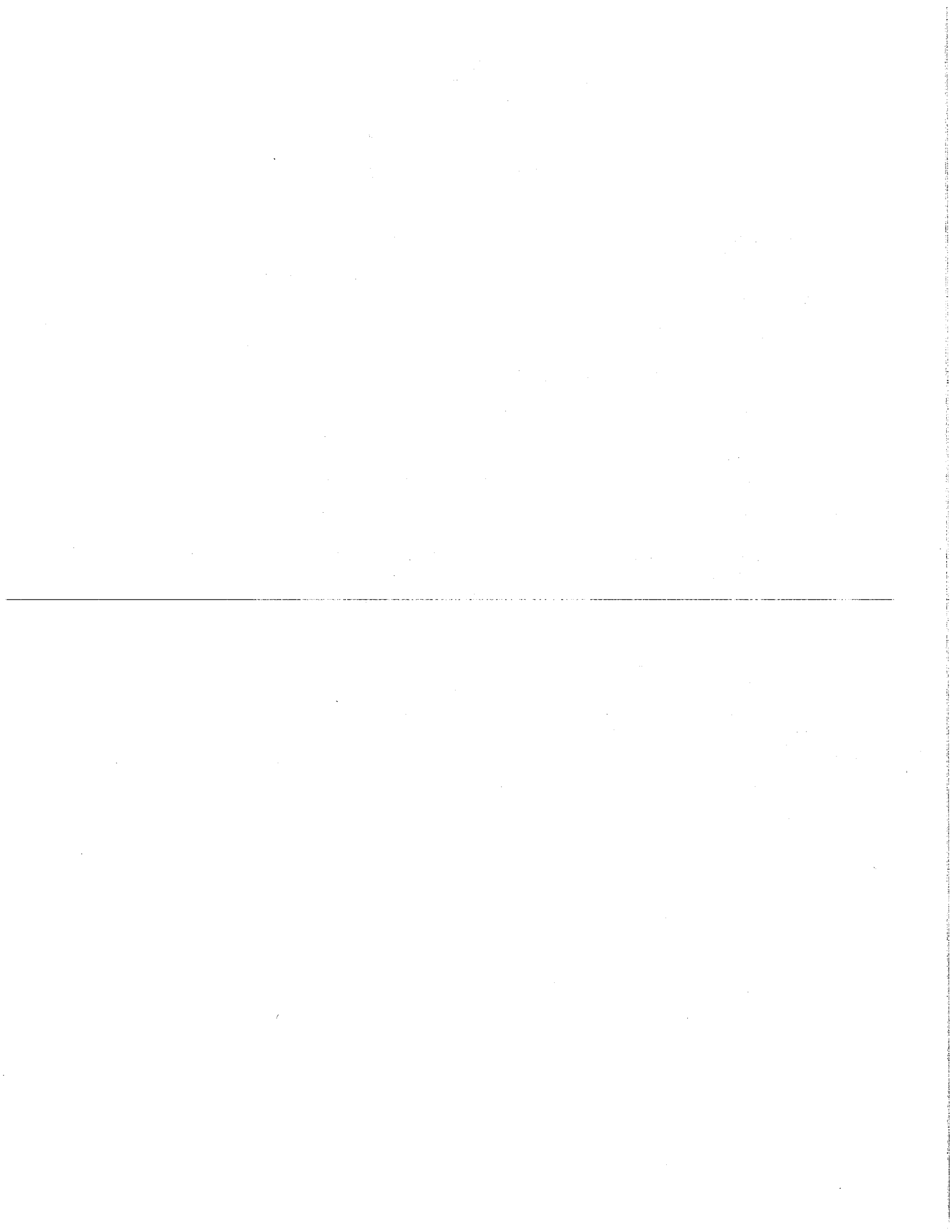

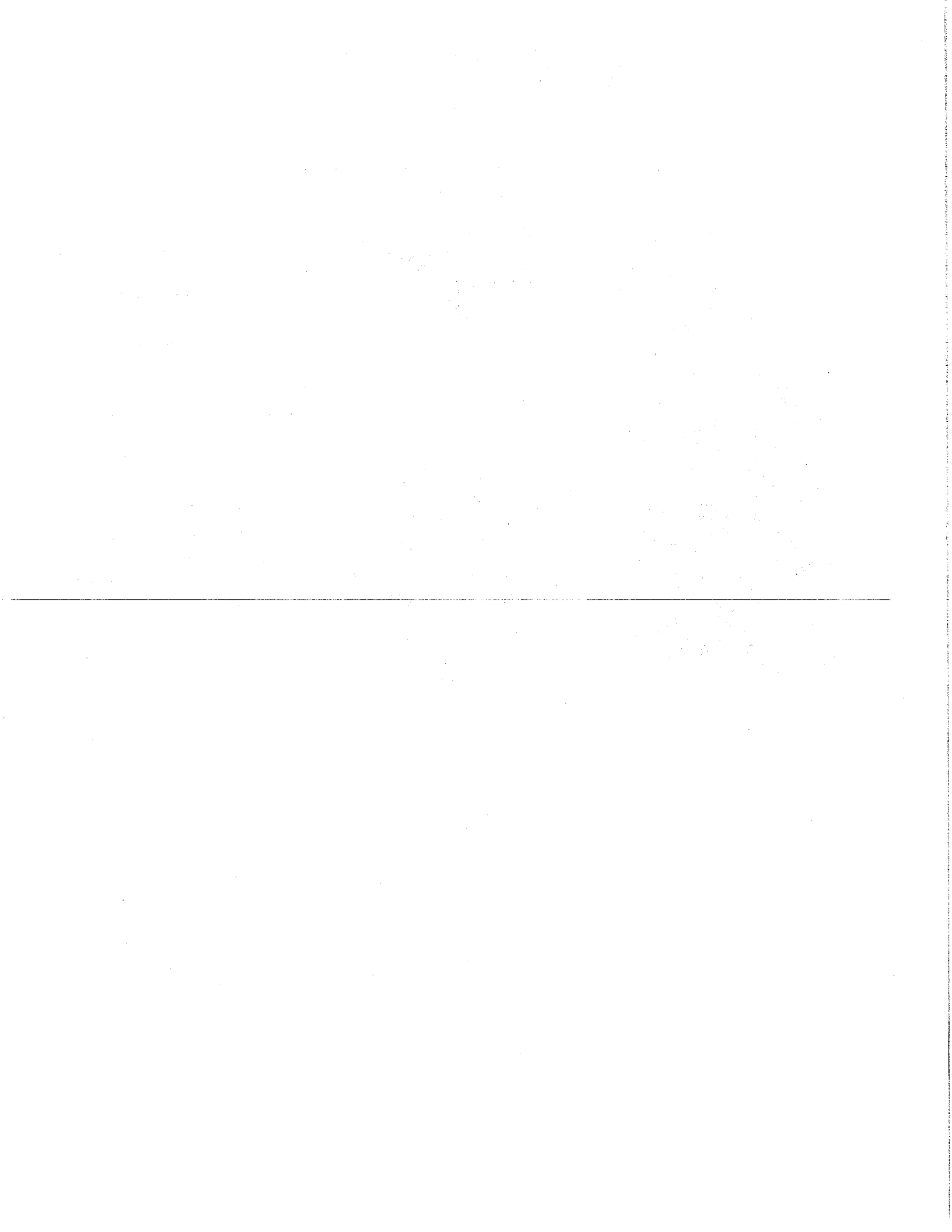

Success Story:

I began working with Thad H in December of 2025. I assisted him and his family with several food boxes initially. Thad expressed interest in obtaining employment. He was released from prison roughly 4 years ago but is still struggling to find stable employment. His barrier to employment is primarily transportation. Due to his past affiliations, he is not comfortable riding public transportation. He also had several tickets he needed to take care of before he could drive. I assisted him in getting to the DMV and court so he could pay his tickets. His license is now in good standing however he does not have a car yet. I then worked with Thad to find a new job, as the previous position I assisted him with did not work out. I drove him to Green Hills grocery store to fill out an application. He received a call back, and I drove him to his interview. He was hired as a cook and is still employed there currently. He occasionally reaches out for a ride to work. We hope that soon he will be able to purchase a car.
